Whale Regatta a 'Whale of a Success,' Organizers Say

17 crews raced from Alamitos Bay to Newport Beach.

American Legion Yacht Club in Newport Beach, in conjunction with Navy Yacht Club of Long Beach, sponsored the second annual Whale Regatta, an SCYA-sanctioned PHRF ocean race, March 27. Seventeen boats participated

in this event, which is dedicated to the annual migration of whales.

Despite the fact that no whales were spotted, the second annual Whale Regatta was successful, organizers said even with inclement weather that weekend. There was a 283 percent increase in the number of boats racing over last year.

There were four classes in the ocean race from Alamitos Bay to Newport Harbor. The classes included two cruising classes and two PHRF classes, which split the fleet most evenly between cruising and PHRF A and B.

The racers converged upon Navy YC of Long Beach Friday and Saturday, enjoying the hospitality offered by Tony Reitdyk, Fleet Captain of Navy YC of Long Beach and his wife, Becky. A barbecue was hosted by Navy YC, with music provided by D.J. Tony, along with bocci ball, bolo ball, dancing and a ing out of Angel's Gate. All classes then proceeded down the coast to Newport Beach, finishing at the Balboa Pier. The festivities continued at 5:30 p.m. at American Legion YC in Newport Beach, where awards were presented.

PHRF A first place went to David Gray from *Pendragon*, and second place went to Jeff Burch from *Hot Ticket*. PHRF B first place went to Todd Hill from *Bhail A Dhia*, and second place went to

Cruising Class C first place went to Gunnar Swanson from *Tara*, and second place went to Floyd and Barbara Sanford from *Doll Fun*.

Cruising Class D first place went to John Wolczanski from *Spirit of Ohana*, and second place went to Leo Vortouni from *Diversion*.

The format of

the event was changed from last year, combining a cruise with a barbecue and an overnight raft-up at Navy Yacht Club with a Sunday morning race start from Alamitos Bay to Newport Beach.

All of the boats with the exception of Thomas Cornelius' *Bellissima* and Rich Detwiler and Eric Walther's *Go Time* made the pre-race festivities.

Tom Cornelius made his racing more challenging picking up his crew, Ron Costabila, from Al and Kathi Gussin's boat, *Sea Therapy*, in Alamitos Bay 15 minutes prior to the start of the race.
