Congratulations are in order to three of our racing members who are representing the Club in the SLBYC Saturday Sailors Series: In PHRF B, Heinz Butner, on Raptor, is in first place with a first and a second finish. In PHRF C, Ben Smith, on Renegade, is in second place with a first and a third finish. And, in PHRF D, Paul Turang, on Dawn Patrol, is in second place with a third and a first finish.

In the SLBYC 2017 High Points standing, Heinz Butner is leading the fleet with 183 points. WAY TO GO Heinz!

The Tuesday Salty Sailors regattas are in full swing, come out and join us for a great afternoon sail: The results follow:

- 12/27 race, three boats on course #18, 6.2 miles, wind in the 6.0 to 11.0 knot range, in first place Callisto II by three second, followed by Raptor and Windhaven.
- 1/3 race, four boats on course #8, 6.2 miles, wind in the 2.0 to 5.0 knot range, in first place Callisto II (second week in a row), followed by Windhaven, Dos Amigos and Chateau.
- 1/7 rained out
- 1/17 race, five boats, course 14, 7.1 miles, wind in 5.0 to 12.5 range, in first place Shadowfax, followed by Raptor, Lulu, Swell Lover, and Running Free.
- 1/24 race, five boats, course #4, 6.8 miles, wind in the 4.0 to 9.0 range, in first place, Raptor, Callisto II, Macs, Windhaven and Chateau.
