The first race of the Long Beach Harbor Series, the April Fools Regatta hosted by Shoreline YC was held on March 31st. Four Navy Yacht Club boats participated. In PHRF A, J109s Raptor and Shadowfax finished first and second. In PHRF B fleet Renegade finished third. In PHRF Non-Spinnaker Wind Haven finished first. Great sailing by all!!

Tuesday Sailing continues. The races are a pursuit style race and goal is to finish close together. This is one of the easiest ways to go racing. If you don't have a sailing vessel just bring yourself – there is always a skipper in need of crew. The club website has the most recent NYCLB Senior Salty Sailors course chart: **26 February 2018.**

The Tuesday SS results follow:

April 3 race: We had six boats on course # 25, 6.3 miles, wind in the 6 to 13.5 knot range. In first place Shadowfax, followed by Raptor, AmelEden, Macs, Windhaven and Green Dragon.

April 10 race: We again had six boats on course # 39, 7.3 miles, wind in the 6 to 12.0 knot range. In first place Macs, followed closely by Raptor, Green Dragon, Shadowfax, Love & War and Windhaven.

April 17 race: had five boats on course # 21, 6.9 miles (very fun outside course), big wind in the 8 to 18.0 knot range. In first place Shadowfax, followed closely by Macs, AmelEden, Green Dragon and Love & War (some confusion on Love & War start time).

April 24 Race: NYCLB had another mini-J/fest four J/boats on course # 5, 7.5 miles, wind in the 6 to 13.0 knot range. In first place Shadowfax, followed closely by Macs, Raptor and Love & War.

Member's Corner

I thought I'd write this article due to the influx of new members in the last year or two.

What I'm writing about is "Yachting Protocol". Webster's Dictionary defines protocol as, "a code prescribing strict adherence to correct etiquette and precedence". Many of the yachting routines, traditions, and protocols we practice today had their beginnings when primitive man first went to sea.

Several yacht clubs were started in the U.S. during the 1820's and 30s but none remained in operation. In the afternoon of 30 July 1844, nine men gathered in the main cabin of the schooner "Gimcrac" and formed the New York Yacht Club with John C. Stevens as Commodore. The clubhouse was commissioned in 1901. In 1881 Lloyd Register listed 21 American yacht clubs.

Now I want to bring to light a very important item and that would be "Visiting Protocol and Courtesies". I look at it this way; a yacht club is no different from a person's home with respect to guests. Most yacht clubs in Southern California that reciprocate with other yacht clubs in the area will do so on a formal basis. Under no circumstances, should a yachtsman assume that all yacht clubs are reciprocal, and before requesting entrance to another club, should check with his club to insure a reciprocal agreement exists. To make your visit to another club more enjoyable just follow some simple rules of courtesy.

Verify you have reciprocal privileges. If you are arriving by boat, fly your burgee and call ahead to insure space is available and that your visit will not conflict with other club functions. When making arrangements, ask about club and marina rules and always sign the guest register.

Most important always have a current membership card and be prepared to show it courteously to staff and members of the club that you are visiting. Another item is always wear your name tag or badge from your club. Always be courteous to club employees. Patronize the facilities of the club.

Most clubs want you to enjoy your visit at their facility. Traditional yachting protocol, courtesy and a thank-you will achieve this goal.

I've taken these items from Yachting Protocol Guidelines booklet published by Southern California Yachting Association. I believe we have a copy at our clubhouse and would suggest looking through it. There are 7 sections and each is worthy to look through. There is also a section of the Burgees of Clubs, Harbor Associations and Affiliated Organizations. There are 93 yacht club burgees listed.

I just wanted to point out some important items that you and I would run into. I've taken our boat to many clubs here in southern California, up to Marina Del Rey down to Dana Point and of course Catalina Island and each time we've had a great time at the visiting yacht club. Now go out and enjoy being a member of Navy Yacht Club Long Beach.

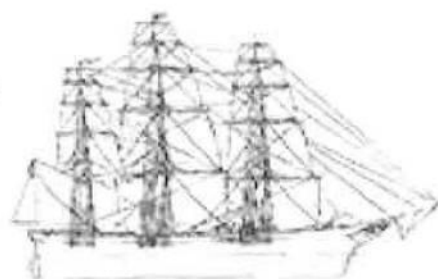

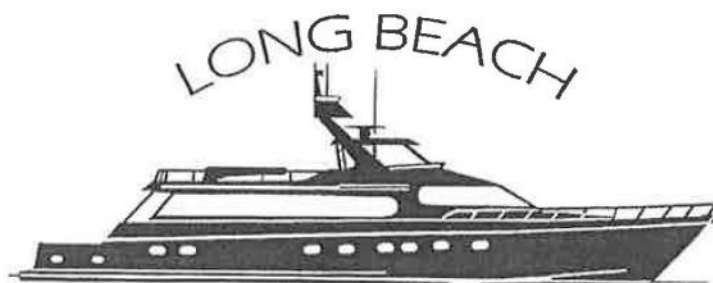
